April Fools for Christ



This year, Easter Sunday falls early in April. And, of course, April Fool's Day marks the beginning of this month. These two events have more in common than we might think. On Easter Monday, and, in later centuries, the Sunday after Easter, some Christians have celebrated "Holy Humor." That is a custom rooted in the idea that God played a spectacular practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. It may have been inspired by the famous Easter midnight sermon of John Chrysostom (344-407 A.D.)—his name means "golden-mouthed" -- who described a vision of Christ confronting the devil and laughing at him. Laughing at evil is the last thing that evildoers want or expect.

Perhaps the women who brought spices felt they had been foolish to trust Jesus, as they grimly headed to the tomb for their last act of love for the man who had been their hope for new life. People had thought Jesus was a fool for heading to Jerusalem – even when he was told that powerful folks there were actively plotting to kill him. People had thought Jesus was a fool for allowing himself to be arrested, for not defending himself before Pilate, for not using his divine power to call on an army of angels to overthrow his tormenters. Later, the miserable grieving followers of Jesus thought the women were on a fool's errand when they told the disciples about seeing the empty tomb, when they shared the amazing message that Jesus was alive. Fear seems to us to be so sensible, and moving from fear to faith can feel so foolish.


It is of course quite possible to be just plain foolish – not "fools for Christ." Judas was foolish to betray Jesus. Did he think he could take matters into his own hands and set Jesus up to act against his enemies? Pilate was foolish to think that he could actually wash his hands of his involvement in killing Jesus. The religious authorities were foolish to think that they could actually silence Jesus forever. Peter was foolish to think that nothing could shake his unwavering loyalty to Jesus.

The Apostle Paul referred to himself and the early Christians as "fools for Christ's sake." In the first chapter of I Corinthians, he writes, "For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength."

Such blessed topsy-turvy foolishness: the last shall be made first; the rejected stone becomes the cornerstone; those who wish to become great must serve; the lost will be found; the small will become great. When we are weak, God's strength can shine through us.

Is it foolish to hope for change that promotes truth and peace and healing? Is it foolish to trust that God will make a difference in a world so relentlessly drenched in blood? Is it foolish to think that the greatest strength comes not from force and fear, but from vulnerability and authenticity for the sake of honoring God as we serve in solidarity with our neighbor? Is it foolish to trust that what unites us in Christ is stronger than any of our differences?

God had the last laugh over death, after all. We can be April Fools for Christ because of the most amazing thing of all –the Easter tomb is empty. Our Lord promises to meet us and lead us where we live and work, no matter what. Christ is Risen, indeed.

Register by March 30th for April 1st session. Future sessions: May 20th and June 3rd.





Our Wednesday Evening Lenten Service soloists: Bill Strecker, John McIntyre and Patricia McIntyre.


Our Parish Administrator Jennifer Black for providing all our printed and online worship materials, keeping us informed of our schedule of activities and performing many unseen but necessary tasks.
