### Watch for the Good Stuff



The news these days can be disorienting and even frightening, clobbering us like cracks in the firmament of existence. We can appreciate the prophet Isaiah pleading with God: break though those cracks and come down here to help us – in the midst of our enduring mess of mishaps and misdeeds. In the season of Advent, waiting and watching for God to act, our Scripture lessons tell us to keep awake, to stay alert. But what should we keep alert for?

We can easily fall into just seeing the negative in our lives. Stuff happens, and the *negative* stuff makes a stronger and more lasting impression. A *New York Times* article, "Praise Is Fleeting, but Brickbats We Recall" notes that "the power of a setback to increase frustration is over *three times* as strong as the power of progress to decrease frustration." Also, "bad events wear off more slowly than good ones." It takes *five* positive events to make the same impact as one negative event.

So, we surely can get discouraged. A couple of years ago, I had lost a notecard that I bought to send to my niece. She had sent me a lovely card for Thanksgiving, expressing appreciation for being a role model for her. But her appreciative note sat on my table, ignored while I was looking all over for the lost card I wanted to send. At that same time, my printer at home had run out of ink. I had gotten a 20% off coupon from CVS, so I stopped there to buy a cartridge – and then I couldn't find my coupon at the checkout counter. So it was one of those days when the collection of little negative things was really getting me down.

It was time to watch for the gift of being able to reframe these negative things: at CVS, I was assured I could bring the ink back if I found the coupon, and I got a \$4 off coupon for buying the ink. So that evening, I looked again for the notecard, and found it, on the floor behind the inkless printer – but after I found something else that I also needed to deal with. I also found the "20% off" coupon, right where I had put it and somehow missed seeing it the day before. So I was able to get the discount on the ink, and an additional \$4 off because of the coupon I had gotten the day before. And I sent off the card that I had found to my niece.

19<sup>th</sup> century Danish philosopher Søren Kierkegaard wrote: "Life can only be understood *backwards*, but it must be lived *forwards*." Dealing with that tension, stay awake. Take spiritual care of yourself by watching and waiting for God's grace in your life, and share kindness with others. Look back and remember what positive things God has done, and trust, in this season of looking to the future, that God is in the midst of our lives for good, now. Watch for the Good Stuff!



### Did you know?

12/31/23

An "RMD" is a Required Minimum Distribution from your Traditional IRA. RMD is required beginning with tax year after you become 72 years old. RMDs remitted directly to a Qualified Charity (such as Tripity Lytheren



directly to a Qualified Charity (such as Trinity Lutheran Church), are not included in your taxable income. Consequently, the income taxes you pay are less.

RMDs sent by the IRA administrator directly to a charity are "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCDs) and are not included in your taxable income subject to Federal or state income tax. QCDs are not deductible as an itemized deduction.

If you are required to have Required Minimum Distributions from your IRA accounts, speak to your Financial Advisor about QCDs. After consulting with your financial advisor, let your IRA custodian know you wish to make a QCD. Be sure to provide them with the information they request. Do not ask the IRA custodian to send the QCD to you. They must send the QCD directly to the charity.

At October 31, 2023, unified giving and other revenues were \$7,362.44 higher than the previous year, and were \$5,758.58 higher than budget for the year. Expenses were \$7,010.52 lower than budget for the year, but much higher than the previous year. Year to date expenses exceeded revenues by \$3,026.73. Please note there is a budgeted dieficit of \$18,955 for the whole year.




### What you need:


