Giving Thanks for All of It



The month of November is the season of Thanksgiving. But giving thanks is so much more than a day sharing turkey and pumpkin pie with family and friends. We can "set the spiritual table" for Thanksgiving by reflecting on God's generosity.

It's an occasion to give thanks for all of God's gifts in the creation, fertile soil producing the bounty of the fields, clean water and clear air. I have been admiring the trees that turn such beautiful colors in this season. As I am driving, every time I see the brilliant red of the trees I give thanks to God for the "wow." One thing that makes it so precious is the knowledge that it is time-limited. If the trees were bright red all year, we would not appreciate them so deeply.

I give thanks for music as a way to connect with God. We can give thanks for the years of faithful work of so many in making possible the new pipe organ, and for all the gifted musicians in the congregation who contribute to making this a strength of your life together.

One favorite hymn of mine, For the Fruit of All Creation (ELW 679) reminds me to give thanks for meaningful work that cares for our neighbors and provides for our families, because this is God's work of caring for us and for the earth. But I particularly appreciate the last part of the final verse:

For the wonders that astound us For the truths that still confound us, Most of all, that love has found us, thanks be to God.

God works through human creativity and the wonder of learning new things; this verse reminds us to thank God for the "wow" of the "wonders that astound us." But it also encourages us to thank God, and look for God's help, in the process of continuing to contemplate "the truths that still confound us." In all of it, God can be at work through us, each one in our own way.

The last line is the best, because it celebrates the grace of love that finds us, God's love that we encounter through the faithful people around us. So, the month of November starts with remembering and giving thanks for "All the Saints" who have sustained us, inspired us, taught us, cared for us. Gifts in memory of those Saints have underwritten a significant part of the cost of the new organ.

I give thanks for all the faithful saints who share their time and many talents. A special "thank you for serving" goes out to those are completing their Council terms: Adam Pomfret and John Neuenschwander. To those who will be elected to the Council, thanks for your willingness to serve. For all of it, thanks be to God.



Why CHANGE? OR Change... WHY?



If you look closely at the picture you will see that **our** communion set lid is engraved "Unity Lutheran Church".

When I first started helping with communion clean up—I wondered why the name wasn't Trinity? When I asked, I was told Unity was the original name of our community of faith. The underside of the lid is

engraved: "Presented by Mrs. Laughner's Sunday School Class 9-16-24". So...our communion set is over 99 years old!

Just as the *name* of our community has changed, so our important mission and guiding principles have been revised several times over the years. These statements direct and inspire us as we live out the Gospel.

Most of our elected and appointed church leaders gathered at the church on Saturday **September 9th**. Our Church Council and E-connect team members were guided by Pastor Nancy Nyland, Indiana Kentucky ELCA Synod Director for Evangelical Mission. Our purpose was to craft new guiding statements by reflecting on our neighbors, the needs around us and the assets God has given.

Beginning with Bible study and prayer, we worked in small groups first, then through several versions in group discussion to final consensus.

It is with gratitude for the guidance of the Holy Spirit that we present the *new*Trinity Lutheran Church Purpose statement:

Growing in grace, sharing Christ's love!

Rooted in the Grace of Christ

Listen, trust, and move with the Holy Spirit

Generously share God's gifts

Love our neighbors

Accept and welcome all



Did you know?

An "RMD" is a Required Minimum Distribution from your Traditional IRA. RMD is required beginning with tax year after you become 72 years old. RMDs remitted



RMDs sent by the IRA administrator directly to a charity are "Qualified Charitable Distributions" (QCDs) and are not included in your taxable income subject to Federal or state income tax. QCDs are not deductible as an itemized deduction.

If you are required to have Required Minimum Distributions from your IRA accounts, speak to your Financial Advisor about QCDs. After consulting with your financial advisor, let your IRA custodian know you wish to make a QCD. Be sure to provide them with the information they request. Do not ask the IRA custodian to send the QCD to you. They must send the QCD directly to the charity.



At September 30, 2023, unified giving and other revenues were \$5,807.95 higher than the previous year, and were \$3,984.18 higher than budget for the year. Expenses were \$7,290.97 lower than budget for the year, but much higher than the previous year. Year to date expenses exceeded revenues by \$2,941.10. Please note there is a budgeted dieficit of \$18,955 for the whole year.






